SHORT BIO

Dr. Joe Uziel is the head of the Dead Sea Scrolls Unit at the Israel Antiquities Authority. The unit is responsible for the conservation, documentation, research and presentation of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Joe completed his PhD at Bar-Ilan University on the Middle Bronze Age in the southern Coastal Plain, and now focuses his research on the history and archaeology of Jerusalem, from its earliest urban establishment some 4000 years ago, until late antiquity. Joe has advanced methods applied in the field, using new technologies in order to learn about Jerusalem's ancient population. He and his teams conducted excavations in the past decade in the City of David, Davidson Center and Western Wall Tunnels in which buildings dating from the First Temple Period, the main street of Second Temple Jerusalem and a Roman theater-like structure, the first such building to be discovered in Jerusalem, were discovered.
